53/1920 **PUBLIC PARTICIPATION SESSION**

A member of the public asked if notes of the recent PCC meeting will be made public – clerk confirmed they will be on the website. In response to a question, it was confirmed that the council has been told the pelican crossing at Caradoc will commence construction in October. In response to a further question, it was noted that a site for a dog waste bin is being assessed by SC.

54/1920 **MINUTES**

- a) *Minutes of the meeting with the PCC dated 24<sup>th</sup> September 2019* – noted. It was agreed to inform the PCC that the parish is interested in being a pilot average speed camera village. Cllr. Evans had received a request from Shropshire Farm Vets at The Old Dairy to go and meet them re speeding outside their premises as they have a near miss every week. Cllr. Evans to forward correspondence. They are seeking a mirror and flashing sign saying “concealed turning”. Clerk to liaise with PCC secretary and SC.

- a) *Caradoc View Play area maintenance issues* – it was **RESOLVED** to accept quotes from G Taylor for maintenance to the basket swing and pirate ship.
- b) *30mph sign* – vegetation now cut back
- c) *Speeding/traffic calming scheme* – SC trying to find funding for traffic calming but not further forward at present.
- d) *Missing streetlamps* - column replacement scheme with LED lighting to progress end of this financial year will pick up any missing street lights. Countywide LED lantern replacement scheme to go to next Cabinet meeting for approval of joint Salix/SC funded project. If approved project will commence April 2020.
- e) *Missing VAS by Church* – as per item d. Was site meeting re where to put VAS sign on that church – was suggested to put it just the other side of Birch Close on post looking towards Hanwood Bank road. It was **RESOLVED** that the PC would like the VAS to go on the street light that's just been re-fitted.
- f) *White Lines/Junction Marking Weir Road/Orchard Lane* – no update.
- g) *Traffic Light Warning Signs either side of Bridge* - contractor confirmed today (8/10), the two warning signs will be installed by the end of next week (18/10).
- h) *Road Surface by the Church* – no update.
